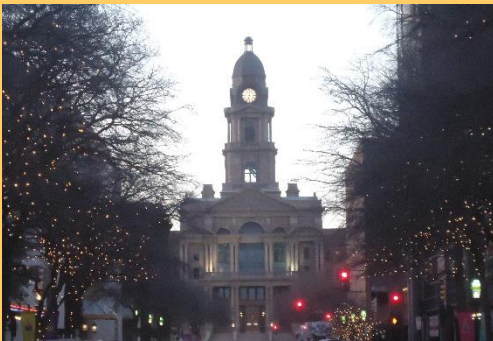

“The Familiar and Not-so Familiar: Properties listed on the National Register of Historic Places in Fort Worth”

March 12, 2016

From the halls of government to ethnic neighborhoods, historic places can tell us much about the development of our communities and shape our sense of place. The National Register of Historic Places is the official Federal list of buildings, structures, sites, objects, and districts deemed worthy of preservation. Susan Allen Kline returns to the Billy W. Sills Center for Archives. She will explore the familiar and unfamiliar places in Fort Worth that are listed on the National Register, the benefits of listing, and offer insights into how Fort Worth measures up to similar sized cities in the number of National Register-listed properties and suggestions for increasing that number.



Susan Allen Kline is a historian and preservation consultant in Fort Worth, Texas who specializes in the documentation of historic buildings for certified rehabilitation tax credits and historic designations. She has successfully prepared National Register of Historic Places nominations for more than thirty historic buildings and landscapes in Texas and Oklahoma. These include the Fort Worth Botanic Garden, the Ridglea Theater, Oakhurst Historic District, the former Our Mother of Mercy Catholic Church, and the Oklahoma City National Memorial. She is also the author of the book *Fort Worth Parks* (Arcadia Publishing, 2010).
