May is Preservation Month

Citizens in Haltom City will join thousands of individuals across the country to celebrate National Preservation Month this May. "Old is the New Green" is the theme of the month-long celebration sponsored by the National Trust for Historic Preservation. Join us in the Birdville Cemetery to celebrate the fact that we have such wonderful history in this area. If you have not taken the time to explore historic structures in this area, I urge you to make time to do this. There is a vast amount of great architecture in Birdville and it is being destroyed daily.

Since the National Trust for Historic Preservation created Preservation Week in 1971 to spotlight grassroots preservation efforts in America, it has grown into an annual celebration observed by small towns and big cities with events ranging from architectural and historic tours and award ceremonies, to fundraising events, educational programs and heritage travel opportunities. Due to its overwhelming popularity, in 2005, the National Trust for Historic Preservation extended the celebration to the entire month of May and declared it Preservation Month to provide an even longer opportunity to celebrate the diverse and unique heritage of our country's cities and states and enable more Americans to become involved in the growing preservation movement.

The architect is working on the plans for the restoration/remodeling of the area that will be our permanent home. We will be located in the BISD Shannon Center which is the location of the original Birdville Schools that started in 1858. The BISD Archives operated by Ida Jo Reynolds will share the space with BHS and hopefully will expand as both collections continue to grow. When everyone in the Birdville area realizes how popular this museum will be, it will be a great asset for the district as well as the entire Birdville area. I talked with Ida Jo last week and she was told that our portion of the remodeling should be complete shortly after the new school year begins.
