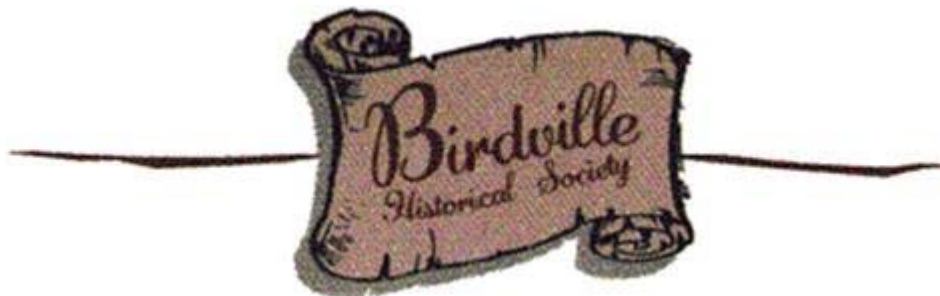

It has been a hope of BHS that the museum would be open more than three days a week but that can't be done without volunteers. The museum operates with two wonderful volunteers and myself who open 3 days a week but it would be nice to be open 5 or 6 days. We have entered about 5000 items and still counting. We will have that many more before we are done. I can't imagine documenting the Smithsonian!!!

Recycle Birdville

On Saturday, Nov. 15, 2014 a replica of the original Birdville Courthouse will be constructed by volunteers and made of cardboard boxes. YES! That is correct. Birdville Historical Society is partnering with the City of Haltom City Beautification Board and the Cities of North Richland Hills, Richland Hills and Watauga, members of the Northeast Environmental Team, to construct a life-sized replica of the 1856 Tarrant County Courthouse that was in Birdville. The group has applied to and has been accepted by the Guinness Book of World Records to be the first to collect and construct a structure of this size from recycled cardboard boxes. The Courthouse will be constructed, documented, photographed and recycled, all in one day. Progressive Waste will take the boxes, recycle them and rebate the funds to BHS. This event will be in conjunction with the Northeast Recycles Day flea market. November 15 is set aside, each year, as America Recycles Day and presents a chance for communities to promote recycling. The flea market has been a Northeast Environmental Team (NEET) annual affair for the past 15 years. The event takes place in the parking lot of The Hills Center (formerly Richland Plaza) located at 6357 Boulevard 26. The flea market will begin at 8 a.m. and close at 2 p.m. There will be 100 vendors, free document shredding from 9 a.m. to noon, and electronics recycling all day. A Good Will truck will be available to take donations from the public and from vendors who do not want to haul their items home.



It is with a very sad heart that I tell you Mrs. Ida Joe Reynolds passed away in August. She and I spent a lot of long hours together moving in and setting up the Birdville Museum. She was always ready to answer any questions and do whatever was needed to preserve the history of the area and the school district. She is dearly missed.
