

## Directions


Ridglea Country Club is located near Interstate 30 in West Fort Worth. For those unfamiliar with Fort Worth, it would be best to approach using I-30.



## Directions (cont.)

West bound traffic on I-30 will need to take Exit 9B to Camp Bowie Blvd. Keep left when the exit lanes split to be carried onto Camp Bowie, headed in a southwesterly direction. Continue on Camp Bowie just under a mile to Berney Anderson Ave. Turn left and the Country Club lies about 1,000 feet straight ahead.


East bound traffic on I-30 should take Exit 9A to Bryant Irvin Rd. Turn right on Bryant Irvin and go 5 blocks south to Camp Bowie Blvd. Turn right and drive about 5 blocks to Berney Anderson Ave. Turn left and the Country Club lies about 1,000 feet straight ahead.

## Directions (cont.)


The contrast is much better on the satellite view. Use this page for the last leg of your trip and look at the following photographs to get an idea of what you will see as you arrive.



## Arriving



As you approach the Country Club, you will encounter a traffic circle. (left)



On the opposite side of the traffic circle you will find the entrance to the Club grounds. (right & below)



Just before you reach the Club House, turn right to enter the west parking area. (right)




## Parking

Because of club renovation, please park on the side of the club near the tennis courts and enter the building nearby. The club will clearly mark the entrance.



Look for signs directing you to the portal (above and right), which leads to the path between the building and the tennis courts. (below)



Signs will guide your way.
