June Meeting

Randy Farmer, brought FWGS a most interesting program when he spoke about Curly Bill. William Albert Brosius was a "character" born in KY but raised in Texas. It turns out Bill had ties to many notorious cattle rustlers and other lawless characters, like John Ringo, Cole Younger, Wyatt Earp and many others. In fact, when Randy found out he was a distant cousin to John Ringo he stumbled across the association with Bill, and thus began many years of investigations. His research took him from AZ to Boston, MA. Randy made great use of tax records, census, microfilmed newspapers, deeds, and genealogical records to trace these men. He employed the **FAN** approach: **F**amily, **A**cquaintances, & **N**eighbors. With men using aliases, it was imperative to trace those associated with Bill. He even found many old photos in the Comanche Indian Nation archives in Lawton, OK. Randy did not start out to be a genealogist but soon saw that he would need to employ these methods in his research. It resulted in his book finished in 2012. From the President..... 

On June 1st Ancestry made public a NEW version of their on-line tree building portion of Ancestry. (Apparently since mid-February some users have been using a Beta test version and giving feedback.) For now, you have the option to toggle in, try it, and if you don't like it, toggle back to CLASSIC version of Ancestry. But, in one ominous Q/A near the end of the FAQ's page:

“Question: Do I have to use the new Ancestry website?
Answer: Not currently. You can return to the old site by simply clicking “Classic Site” on the username drop-down menu. You can also go to the new Ancestry anytime by clicking “New Ancestry” on the same menu.

Be aware that the classic version of Ancestry will not be supported soon. We will notify you in advance before this happens. So you are now WARNED!

I went to the feedback section where users are sampling the new version and commenting. The comments were very helpful but, overwhelmingly negative. (I hope Ancestry is truly listening and sincerely wants to make improvements.) I have not tried the NEW myself. (I am afraid to, after reading all the comments.)

My OPINION: Here is my “take” from all my reading. Ancestry is appealing to the TV viewers and casual users; hobbyists who skew towards scrapbooking. Ancestry says there has been an outcry for more storytelling abilities (visual arts). (Really?) But from the comments I read, the hard-core genealogists don't care how pretty it looks, they want serious usage: dates, facts, resources. Sounds like the age-old dilemma: form vs. function. I am with the serious genealogists on this one. Aren't we taught first in genealogy, facts, facts, facts? We use Ancestry as a tool to find new material. Shouldn't our tool work for us—not against us?

I would be interested if you want to try the new version and comment. Please let me know, or more importantly, let Ancestry.com know. see more on p.3

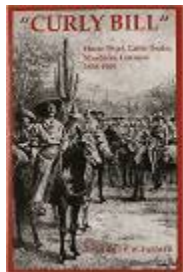
