He comes to several conclusions of his own that are based on new findings in the 1970’s and a reexamination of older evidence. But Sandy asks, was this southern plot to kidnap or kill Lincoln a reaction to an earlier Northern plot to kill all members of the CSA government if caught. GOOD NEWS FOR FAMILY TREE MAKER USERS & ANCESTRY USERS

After the announcement from **Ancestry** in December that they would no longer support FTM software, there has been another decision. The news this February is that your FTM software will still work on Ancestry because FTM was acquired by **Software MacKiev**, a company that has a long relationship with Ancestry and also with FTM software. (They have had the Mac version for 6 years.) Now they will have **Mac & Windows versions** and both will work on Ancestry and your home computer.

The other good news is that now another software will work on Ancestry too. For the first time, **RootsMagic** users will be able to have access to Ancestry hints and searches if they add their trees to Ancestry. Ancestry expects this to be in place by **the end of 2016**.

The decisions will still be yours: use your desktop software only on your computer or link to the Ancestry web site where you can upload or download as you wish. See: **FTM** <http://www.mackiev.com/> and /or **RootsMagic:** <http://www.rootsmagic.com/>

Editor: Ancestry said they are responding to your wishes and needs and happy to offer more options. I wish they had skipped the December drama and just waited for the February announcement which was more positive and did not create panic.
