### DNA In The NEWS

Have you noticed how many times you hear about DNA turning up in a major news story lately. Solving crimes, uncovering long lost suspects, finding lost relatives and reuniting biological families. Two articles read recently, shed some light on the role of DNA in helping adoptees find their birth families. One, entitled “*The Twilight of Closed Adoptions*,” proposes that the era of closed adoptions is over and should be too. With the advent of easy, affordable DNA tests and the mass numbers of Americans participating in them, the odds of an adoptee “getting a hit” leading to their biological family is very good. Some adoptees are just participating in DNA tests for health reasons, and then are shown results pointing to family members. This article thinks the number of participants in these databases has reached “critical mass.” They cite that nearly everyone can find at least a fifth cousin, with some adoptees actually finding a parent. They liken it to a large jigsaw puzzle. Once you have a lead on a fifth cousin, you can keep searching family trees to see where you fit in, leading to a break-through. This article reviews the history of adoptions (open used to be the norm). They make the case that DNA tests are creating “extended families of adoption.” Why not be open just like the families of blended, divorced, and step-families. America has changed, families have changed, maybe the laws should change too.

### Doggie DNA

Another article seen recently was in the August 5<sup>th</sup> issue of *Parade* magazine. Apparently, it is not enough to run the DNA on your human family members, but now you can run your canine family member’s DNA too. The article cited **Wisdom Panel Canine Breed Detection DNA Test** for about \$85. For about \$150, they offer a more extensive test with health implications, much like the human tests do at **23 & Me**. This company lets you know information and traits specific to different breeds, once the test results are in. They also claim to have the world’s largest breed database. Just like many human tests, you swab the dog’s cheek to obtain a sample. Right now, they are offering a \$10 off promo.

The Genealogy world lost a giant recently with the death of **Lloyd Bockstruck** of Dallas. While never a FWGS member, Lloyd was a frequent speaker for us. He headlined so many seminars over the years, always drawing quite the crowd. He was known for his extensive knowledge on almost any subject, especially geography and history. One of his particular favorites was the Colonial period and Revolutionary history. Lloyd was quite simply one of the best lecturers in the US genealogy community.

In addition to lecturing he had been supervisor of the genealogical section of DPL where many were first introduced to him. He was always there to help another patron with his expertise. In his earliest career, he had taught school in Africa.

In addition to being an excellent researcher, he used that skill to compile works for the genealogy world. His books are standards in the genealogy department of libraries all across the US. His name will certainly be remembered.
