February Regular Monthly Meeting

On February 28th, the general meeting of the FWGS was held at the Fort Worth Central Library. Shirley Apley spoke on the ideas David Hackett Fischer put forth in his book, *Albion's Seed: Four British Folkways in America*. Fischer's basic thesis is that although less than twenty percent of the present U. S. population has British antecedents, our British genesis is still the dominate factor determining our culture. Four mass emigrations from four different regions of Britain by four different socio-religious groups before the American Revolution produced a distinct regional culture which can still be seen in America today. The New England Historic Genealogical Society says *Albion's Seed* is "one of the greatest works of American history."
