“Genealogical Finds in the Special Collections of the UTA Library”

BRENDA S. McCLURKIN will use her skills in genealogy & tell us about some special historical manuscripts & other overlooked materials at the UTA Library. This is her first visit to FWGS!!!

Brenda has long had a passion for archives and historical research and has taken an atypical journey toward her dream. She processed her first archival collection as a senior history student at Colorado Woman's College in Denver and was immediately "smitten." She began her career as a library assistant providing reference service in the Western History Department of the Denver Public Library. In her native Arizona, she detoured into architectural librarianship, and ultimately into real estate brokerage and construction. Returning to her passion, she completed her Master's in Library Science degree at the University of Arizona in 1991, and worked 3 years at the State Library of Arizona heading the Federal Documents Unit. Moving to Texas in 1994, she was quick to volunteer her services in local archival collections of the Ball-Eddleman-McFarland House in Fort Worth, Weatherford College, and the Weatherford Public Library. She obtained an Archival Administration Certificate at The University of Texas at Arlington in 2000 and was admitted to the Academy of Certified Archivists in 2002. Brenda has served as the Historical Manuscript Archivist in Special Collections of the University of Texas at Arlington Libraries for over four years.

You do not have to be a member of the Fort Worth Genealogical Society to become a member of Pioneer Families of Tarrant County and there are no additional fees other than the original \$10 application fee.

If you descend from one of the Pioneer Families of Tarrant County, you certainly would want your family's rich heritage recorded, preserved and celebrated. Eligibility is open to anyone who can prove direct decent from an early Tarrant County family who resided here in or before 1870.
