MARCH MEETING

Roger Cobb, brought the March program on his very own experiences using DNA testing to overcome his BRICK WALL. On his own surname Cobb he found that his great grandmother was married to Mr. Mills, then left him to marry Mr. Cobb while pregnant from Mr. Mills. That child was given the Cobb name and was never told his true parentage. When Roger did his Y DNA test, he did not match any COBB participants, but he did match the MILLS. The truth was uncovered and a huge mystery solved. Since then, Roger has become a true advocate and scholar on the subject of DNA testing for genealogical uses. He shared many of the basics of the 3 major DNA tests: **Y** (for males only; follows the male surname), **Mt** (follows the female line only, mother to mother) and the **autosomal** test (which indicates your origins and tracks up the middle of your tree.) He gave us reasons to use each of the 3 major companies: **Ancestry, 23 and Me**, and **Family Tree DNA** (which has the largest database of all.) Thanks to Roger for a very informative night! He invited us to the “Grapevine Name Droppers” who meet in the Grapevine Public Library where they sometimes discuss the results of DNA tests. **Come to our Meetings and Bring a Friend!
