Your searches may include DAR members' lineages or proofs, Patriots & service given, descendants of both, Bible records and what is available in the DAR library. ANCESTRY TIDBITS

Free Databases at Ancestry.com

We all know that Ancestry.com is *the* premium fee-based genealogical website. We know they have online **records*** for searching (some are even scanned images.) And we know it is a web site to place and share your family tree on-line. (More than 31 million have submitted their family trees to date, and it is growing!)

But you have to pay, right!?

I recently taught the CUG meeting for the society. There, I am always asked about Ancestry. Is it free or do you have to pay? My answer has always been—PAY. If you try a FREE 14 day trial, you must put up a credit card. Then you will be charged if you do not quickly decline to continue to subscribe. As I was doing research for the CUG, I ran across these following tidbits about free databases at Ancestry. *Yeah, right, I thought.* The tidbit said that one of Ancestry's best kept secrets is that they also have over 1,800 **always-free** databases. To view these free records, you may be asked to sign up for a free account, but the account is free, no strings attached. **You do not need a free trial to view these records.** I was still skeptical, but vowed to bring it up at the CUG. Sure enough, one participant told me that she has used Ancestry for free for multiple years. She even began and continues to build her tree there for free. She admits and realizes that there are records she does not have access to and cannot read as a "free-user." So, I have now cautiously changed my answer when pondering, "is it free or pay?" Of course, I still whole-heartedly can recommend a subscription to Ancestry.com. It is worth it! **Debbie Pearson**
