She informed us that Quakers held beliefs that all people are children of God regardless of race or color. While some Quakers did hold slaves after they entered the US, the growing pressure from their leadership was to divest themselves. Many meeting groups would set up trusts to purchase and hold the slaves until they could be transported to northern states and freed. These records can be found in meeting minutes & sometimes in courthouse records. She provided us with a 4 page handout. We passed out 2 pages at the meeting.
